## **Anabaptist/Pietist Beliefs**

We believe that Christianity is all about an obedient love-faith relationship with Christ. We believe that obedience to Jesus' teachings is not optional. To us, the goal of Christianity is the Kingdom and Glory of God, not just a "personal Salvation". To us, the Kingdom of God (in its representative form) begins now, and culminates in the future in its fulfillment and glory. It is a reality to be experienced now by living out the teachings of Jesus (especially the Sermon on the Mount). We understand the Epistles in light of Jesus' clear teachings in the Gospels. We believe in two kingdoms, (as taught by Jesus) and do not use force to impose a Christian ethic on society. We believe that in God's Kingdom the Gospel ethic is obeyed voluntarily without the use of carnal force. We see the Kingdom of God as the society God originally intended, made possible by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and that believers are empowered by the Spirit of God to conquer sin and demonstrate what the world would look like if everybody obeyed the King.
